Stone County Library is now fine free! In February of 2019 the Board of Trustees George Scott, President voted to end charging late fees to patrons. As director, this has been one of the most exciting changes to see at SCL! It allows us to be more focused on helping our patrons, and removes stress from those who struggle with transportation to the library. We have had a lot of positive feedback from our patrons who love this change, too!

> Over the past year, we have added staff at all of our branches to better serve the needs of our communities. The library also started updating many things including the website, servers, and more. On top of that, the library received \$7,530 in grants for our Summer Reading Program! We partner with 45 libraries across the state to share physical resources using the state courier company, and we partner with 109 libraries across the state to offer digital materials through Overdrive. That gives Stone County residents access to millions of books, audiobooks, videos and more!


> Of course, our biggest project during the year was the work at our Crane Branch. We completed phase one which renovated the front of the building. Then, phase two began when the library hired GHN architects to plan the interior renovation and expansion of the building. Construction is scheduled to start during the first quarter of 2020, and should be completed during the summer of 2020.


